



New Zealand Geographical Society Honorary Life Fellowship Award

Honorary Life Fellowship of the New Zealand Geographical Society (HLFNZGS) recognises outstanding and sustained contributions and service by a member of the Society in an area of direct or indirect interest to the New Zealand Geographical Society.

The contributions and service may include:

- Branch office holder;
- Council delegate;
- National office holder;
- NZBoGT representative or office holder;
- Longstanding participation in branch or national activities;
- Longstanding participation in NZBoGT related activities;
- Editorship of an NZGS journal;
- Editorship of conference proceedings;
- Editorship of NZGS books;
- Editorship of NZGS newsletters or website;
- Representative of the NZGS on national boards, committees and organisations;
- Representative of the NZGS on international boards, committees and organisations;
- NZGS Conference organiser or committee member;
- Organiser of NZGS workshop, symposium or seminars;
- Promoter of NZGS activities, initiatives and interests;
- Significant individual sponsor of NZGS activities.

Both nominee and nominator must be members of the NZGS.

Nominations should include:

- A written statement in support of the nomination, signed by the nominator.
- A brief CV outlining these contributions to NZGS.

The award consists of a certificate and a citation presented at the NZGS Annual General Meeting (AGM).

A call for nominations will be sent out by the National Secretary of the Society by beginning of March. Nominations will be accepted until mid April. Nominations should be e-mailed to the National Secretary.

Announcement of Honorary Life Fellowship will be made at the Society AGM, in the *New Zealand Geographer*, on the NZGS website <http://www.nzgs.co.nz/>, in the New Zealand Royal Society *Alert*, and through a Press Release. A list of recipients can be found on the NZGS website.
